

GUIDELINES FOR SENDING COMMENTS TO FERC AFTER MARCH 23, 2018

- Each comment should be on one topic (area of concern). Don't submit a comment that touches upon multiple issues. Rather, address each of your concerns in separate comments.
- Use sample comments as a framework, but reword them, add other information or details that are important to you, and try to be clear about why you have this concern as well as what you expect FERC to do. Samples can be found on this website as well by reading the submissions of others on the FERC docket for CP17-101.
- You can send as many comments as you wish.
- At the beginning, list the one topic for the comment. *Example:* Concern: Health Impacts of Emissions
- Begin each comment with "I am an intervenor in the CP17-101 project, Northeast Supply Enhancement Project."
- Basic issues with the DEIS:
 - (1) Even though there were numerous data gaps, incomplete analyses of potential adverse impacts, and assumptions without providing supporting scientifically-based evidence, FERC published the DEIS and concluded that "approval of the Project would result in some adverse environmental impacts; however, all impacts would be reduced to less-than-significant levels with the implementation of Transco's proposed mitigation and the additional measures recommended in the draft EIS."
 - (2) This insufficient DEIS does not address all of the concerns that have been raised by the public, and it does not allow the public to have meaningful input due to missing information and lack of thorough analyses of impacts.
 - (3) The time period provided for the public to review the DEIS and prepare to provide public input is inadequate since the missing information and analyses should be available for consideration prior to the end of the comment period.
